

Twin Falls IRLP Node 3541

This information is furnished by Chris Hembree, W7CTH. Chris has an IRLP node in operation at his home in Twin Falls and he has graciously allowed other hams to participate in its use. Please be courteous and follow all instructions on its usage. Please, ALWAYS ID with your call sign before using.

I would recommend that you go to www.irlp.net first. This will give you the opportunity to see other node users where they are located around the world to call.

This is an Echolink/IRLP node. That means that you can call anyone who is on Echolink from this IRLP node in Twin Falls 3541. The people on Echolink can call the node as well. This is great because you are not tied down to a computer to talk. You only need to have a radio on UHF 446.725 simplex, PL-tone 162.2.

All IRLP nodes are 4 digits. To bring up an IRLP node first listen to 446.725 and then listen again. Some of us use HT's and you may not hear them.

ID with your call sign, push the 4 digits that you are calling, then ID when you connect with their node. Please don't key up too fast because it takes time for all the nodes to connect.

(The IRLP system is one big family with respect for each other and how we use the system.)

When you are finished talking, push 73. This will bring the node down. Then ID again.

When you bring up an Echolink node, there are 4 digits or more. Push a star * in front of the echolink node number. Same to bring it down (73).

This is an English speaking node only. This is because the owner is responsible for the content over the link so the language must be one that is understood by the owner. The owner of this link reserves the right to disconnect or turn off the link at any time, especially during times of questionable usage.
